Erasmus+ Youth field of KA1 Youth Exchange project Smart communication

Smart communication is an educational program of the Federation of Children's and Youth Municipal Councils. This program aims to provide supervised learning process for participants in the field of communication both offline and online. The concept is to teach the participants to use communication effectively and confidentially.

Overview of the project

The project would like to welcome partners and their representatives who are interested about a co-managed youth exchange which is a really important aspect. Meaning that the proposal is planned and carried out by the Association with the support of the Federation of Children's and Youth Municipal Councils (coaching process) but the implementation would be done by group leaders, invited facilitators mostly. For that reason all group leaders would be invited for an Advanced Planned Visit prior the youth exchange.

Objectives

- to create a training environment for participants where they can reflect on themselves in order to develop their competence to communicate successfully and share their opinion
- to show some examples about communication skills by using different techniques and methods
- to provide tools and methods and possibility to develop skills to support participant's learning processes (public speaking, critical thinking, to explore non-verbal communication skills, etc.)
- to offer a learning space for young people about cultures
- to teach how to use social media and IT tools effectively (Kahoot, Menti, Padlet, Facebook, Instagram etc.)

The programme will be designed in a way that young people will have the chance take the ownership over the program, and with the support of the group leaders the program will be implemented.

Methods used

The youth exchange will be based on an interactive and participative approach. The processes of learning from each other and learning by doing will be crucial. Non-formal learning methods will be used during the entire program of the youth exchange e.g. world cafe, workshops, simulational practices.

We would like to involve the partners in the dissertation and the online communication during the program.



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Group size

Besides Hungary we would like to invite five other countries. Group size would be the usual 4 young people (2 out of them preferably under 18) and 1 group leader. That means we will have in total 30 young people that are taking part in the youth exchange and 6 group leaders, accompanied with a support staff of 4 people.

Working language

Minimum an basic level of English is required.

Target group

We are looking for 5 partners who work with different groups of young people. The youth exchange is aimed to involve organizations or informal group of young people from Erasmus+ YOUTH IN ACTION PROGRAMME COUNTRIES who have already registered on the Participant Portal and obtained a PIC code.

We are looking for organization who is working with young people from different cultural backgrounds or where the diversity is very relevant and visible. We believe that this youth exchange would be also a great opportunity for those who never participated before in any youth exchange or other international projects.

Young people interested about online and offline communication, team building, group work, cultures, active citizenship.

The target group for the youth exchange is between 14-20, and group leaders should be above 18. We would respect if future partners could at least half involve underaged participants in their groups.
